Oklahoma School of Science and Math in Oklahoma City is a residential school which opened in 1990, with its inaugural class of 1992, and is designed for juniors and seniors. Starting in the late 1990's, Senator Ted Fisher from Sapulpa had the vision that not all of the highest achievers juniors and seniors wanted to live in a residential facility in Oklahoma City. **A lot of our rural students wanted to stay at their home schools and participate in extracurricular activities** such as cheerleading, athletics, band, etc. The legislature appropriated \$250,000 per regional site for faculty of two and initial capital investments (equipment, etc.).

The regional sites teach physics and calculus. **Autry's Oklahoma School of Science and Math was started in 2000 with two instructors and has been one of the most successful regional sites of the 8 regional centers left.** Since the beginning, Autry has consistently had 15-18 juniors and seniors, and the success rate has been extraordinary.

## WHY DO WE NEED TO RAISE MONEY?



Starting a few years ago, the legislature has consistently **cut the funding to OSSM** which has resulted in cuts of funding for the regional sites. The **Autry site has lost funding for the second instructor** which forced **Mike Jantz to teach both subjects** in order to serve our students.

Because of the **cuts in funding**, Autry has had just **one teacher**. An additional instructor would allow students to attend a second year taking AP Statistics and Multivariate Calculus. Attempts have been made by local community leaders to get the funding restored, but to no avail. This means if Autry is going to **continue to operate a quality regional site** of the Oklahoma School of Science and Math, it is necessary for us to **raise the funds locally**.



Last year, we were fortunate to have **MeiFoon Eastep teaching part time** for our regional site and at NOC. To fund this part-time position for the next three years, **we need to raise \$100,000**. The money raised would be in a restricted fund at the main campus, **earmarked specifically for the Enid regional center**.
