Autry Technology Center to Host Retirement Celebration and Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

ENID, Okla. – Autry Technology Center will host a retirement celebrating for Superintendent/CEO Brady McCullough and a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the McCullough Lab and new construction on Tuesday, June 29, 2021, from 4 to 6 p.m.

Superintendent McCullough is retiring from his position after six years at Autry Technology Center. During his time at Autry Tech, McCullough has spearheaded several new initiatives including the purchase of a new training facility at 1802 N. Van Buren, new construction on the east end of the main campus for a diesel technology program, a CNC machine program and a fabrication lab as well as the renovation of the culinary arts classroom to create a state-of-the-art training facility. His career with the Oklahoma CareerTech system spans more than three decades.

The McCullough Lab at Autry Technology Center is a high-tech, materials fabrication lab featuring design, prototyping and light production resources for district members. The lab has two main spaces: The Rapid Prototyping Center and a production floor with zones for metal, wood, and soft goods.

Autry Technology Center has been a part of the Enid community since 1967 and is one of 29 CareerTech schools across Oklahoma. The center has more than 25 career programs and offers a wide variety of evening and weekend short-term courses and certifications for many diverse career fields. Autry serves nearly 16,000 individuals each year, including many area employees who receive training through the Corporate Training Department that works with over 500 local businesses each year.
